BidAir Cargo's new sponsorship programme goes beyond the customary focus on supply chain management and commerce, expanding reach to the core of cargo aviation.





Maximising De Minimis

by online shopping continues to grow, seemingly despite attempts to tighten regulations. It seems that the sheer volume - and relentless consumer demand - has outstripped the ability of conventional procedures to monitor and keep track of de minimis imports.

In last month's News Delivery we appended guidelines from SARS concerning South African processes.

Yet the issue is global.

Commercial shipments arriving in the USA valued at under US\$800 currently face no duties

and little scrutiny. In 2023 the country imported more than a billion such shipments. It's impractical and too costly to examine every parcel. Rumours abound that the limit may be reduced or abolished or shipments subject to a fee.

Whatever develops, our industry stands in awe of the sheer size and express logistics capability of this rapid-growth segment - fuelled largely by Chinese entrepreneurship.

And further restrictions, fees and regulations are likely to arouse the ire of the millions of consumers who have adopted express online ordering and delivery so enthusiastically.
